

THE TOP 10



1. Amanda Blumenherst, Duke, Jr.
Two-time player of the year has seven wins, 16 top-5s in 21 overall starts. Has never finished out of the top 10. Enters fall on high after U.S. Women's Amateur runner-up finish.



2. Stacy Lewis, Arkansas, Sr.
Won NAAs with a final-round 66 after T-5 finish at LPGA's Kraft Nabisco. Added Southern Amateur title this summer. Two other wins in 2006-07 (Peg Barnard, Susie Maxwell Bering).



3. Anna Nordqvist, Arizona State, Soph.
National freshman of the year and Pac-10's top player. Top 10 in nation in scoring on par 3s (T-5, 3.06), par 4s (3rd, 4.06) and par 5s (T-9, 4.88). 72.19 overall average.



4. Jacqui Concolino, Vanderbilt, Jr.
First-team All-American won Central Regional and made 110 birdies during the season, fourth most in nation. Hit 72.5% of greens in regulation and 35.9% GIR within 15 feet.



5. Caroline Westrup, Florida State, Jr.
First golfer in school history to be two-time first-team All-American. Two wins and seven top-fives in 2006-07. Also low individual at World Amateur Team last October.



6. Alison Walshe, Arizona, Sr.
Three wins, 73.35 average helped her earn first-team All-American honors. Won Women's North & South in July. Will play for fourth different coach in four years this fall.



7. Maria Hernandez, Purdue, Jr.
Big Ten player of the year in 2007 after posting three wins and 73.2 stroke average. First player in school history to earn first-team All-American honors.



8. Belen Mozo, USC, Soph.
Spaniard joined the Trojans last January and posted six top-20s in seven starts to earn honorable mention All-American honors. 2006 British Amateur champion.



9. Sandra Gal, Florida, Sr.
Low Gator in all 10 of her tournament starts. Defended title at Lady Gator Invitational, one of seven top-10 finishes on season. Posted 70.90 final-round stroke average.



10. Tiffany Joh, UCLA, Jr.
Five top-fives include winning the Pac-10 title and finishing T-5 at NAAs. All but one of her 34 rounds counted for the Bruins last season.
