GOLF WORLD COLLEGE PLAYERS OF THE WEEK



Will Griffin,
Texas Tech

The 19-year-old sophomore from San Antonio birdied his final two holes at Shoal Creek CC in Birmingham, Ala., to post a final-round 70

and grab a share of the individual title with UAB's Brad Smith at the Shoal Creek Invitational. While carding a three-under 213, Griffin helped the Red Raiders earn their first team title since the Hyatt Plantation Club Intercollegiate in March 2006. It was Griffin's second top-10 finish of the season after a T-6 at the Carpet Capital.



Dewi Claire Schreefel,
Southern California

Having gone winless since claiming her 2006 NCAA individual title, the senior from The Netherlands shot rounds of 68-69-67 at New

Mexico's Championship Course in Albuquerque to earn medalist honors by four strokes over Duke's Amanda Blumenherst at the Margaret Branch NCAA Preview. It was the first time in Schreefel's career that she had three straight sub-70 rounds, and her 15-under 204 was one shot off the school record.
