



It's going to be tough to knock off three-time defending NCAA women's champion Duke, but the top-ranked Blue Devils can be beaten. With Duke leading by 12 strokes entering the final round of the Stanford Intercollegiate Oct. 21, Arizona State posted an eight-under 276—including a combined 11 under by **Jennifer Osborn** (final-round 67), **Anna Nordqvist** (67), **Azahara Munoz** (69) and **Juliana Murcia** (73) over the final six holes at Stanford GC in Palo Alto, Calif.—to take the title by four strokes. It was the Sun Devils' first victory in four fall starts, bumping them to No. 2 in the new *Golf World*/NGCA coaches' poll. ... Playing as an amateur, UNLV junior **Seung-su Han** shared medalist honors at Dayton (Nev.) Valley CC (16-under 272) to advance through the first stage of PGA Tour Qualifying School Oct. 26. The 21-year-old from South Korea can remain an amateur and play in the second stage this month, but if he advances and wants to play in the final stage, he will have to turn professional. ... **Vicky Hurst's** victory at the Ping Invitational earlier this month, her third AJGA win of 2007, and **Peter Uihlein's** seven top-10 finishes in nine national junior events helped the duo secure the AJGA's Rolex Junior player of the year honors. It's the first time Hurst (above) has won the award while it marks the second time for Uihlein, winner also in 2005. The two will be honored at the association's annual awards banquet Nov. 18 prior to the Polo Golf Junior Classic at Ginn Reunion Resort outside Orlando. —*Ryan Herrington*

### PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

#### Harris English, Georgia

After earning medalist honors at the Brickyard Collegiate two weeks earlier, the freshman made it back-to-back wins with a three-stroke victory at the Isleworth-UCF Invitational Oct. 24. English's 11-under 205 broke a tournament record, as did his final-round 66. He also helped the Bulldogs win the team title by 21 strokes.



#### Nannette Hill, Wake Forest

The junior from Pelham, N.Y., propelled by a second-round tournament-record 66 at CC of Landfall's Nicklaus course, became the first Demon Deacon to claim a 54-hole title in five years when she shot a one-over 217 to win the Landfall Tradition in Wilmington, N.C., Oct. 28. Hill's efforts also led Wake Forest to the team title (14-over 878, nine strokes ahead of Purdue), its first since 2004.
