Ending the fall in Hawaii proved fruitful for the UCLA women, who claimed the team title at the Kent Youel



Invitational in Honolulu with a 17-over 881, four strokes better than Pac-10 rival USC. Bruin junior **Tiffany Joh** (above) and freshman **Maria José Uribe** shared medalist honors with matching one-over 217s. ... One week after missing the cut at the PGA Tour's Ginn sur Mer Classic at Tesoro, Louisville senior **Derek Fathauer** cruised to a five-shot victory at the UNCG Bridgestone Golf Championship in Greensboro, N.C. Fathauer shot a 10-under 206, closing with a 67-68, to also help the Cardinals claim the team title at Forest Oaks CC, beating Mississippi State by three strokes. ... The Texas Tech men earned their third fall title with a four-stroke victory over UT-Arlington at the Herb Wimberly Intercollegiate in Las Cruces, N.M., shooting a 21-under 831. Red Raider freshman **Sergio Franky** was medalist after shooting a final-round 65 and an 11-under 202 overall at the New Mexico State GC.
