## ShortGame

■ No one on the Northern Illinois men's or women's golf teams was hurt when a former student killed five people and injured 18 others during a shooting rampage in a lecture hall on the DeKalb, Ill., campus Feb. 14. In the aftermath, the Husky men canceled a trip last weekend to Florida to compete in a match with Cincinnati and Florida Gulf Coast. The school announced Feb. 16 all athletic teams would postpone play until Feb. 25. ... NCAA champ **Jamie Lovemark** of USC and his 2007 U.S. Walker Cup teammates **Rickie Fowler** (Oklahoma State), **Billy Horschel** (Florida), **Webb Simpson** (Wake Forest) and **Kyle Stanley** (Clemson) are among 24 players named to the Ben Hogan Award watch list. The award goes to the top men's college player based on both collegiate and amateur performances. The winner will be named in May. ... Stanford's **Conrad Ray** has been picked as the U.S. coach for this June's Palmer Cup. ... A bogey/quadruple-bogey finish by **Cody Gribble** at Redstone GC's Tournament Course, gave **Morgan Hoffman** a three-shot victory at the AJGA's Houston Boys Invitational Monday with a final-round 73 and a two-under 214 total.

### GOLF WORLD COLLEGE PLAYERS OF THE WEEK



#### Grant Doverspike, Fresno State

The sophomore sprained his thumb during the final round of the CSU San Marcos Invitational, but still shot a 69 at San Luis Rey Downs in Bonsall, Calif. His eight-under 208 total earned him medalist honors by three shots and gave the Bulldogs the team title.



#### Natalie Sheary, Wake Forest

The 18-year-old's first college win, a one-shot triumph at the Northrop Grumman Regional Challenge (two-over 215), was the first by a Wake freshman since 1998. It also marked the first time Wake has had back-to-back medalists, after Nanette Hill's win to close the fall.
